DISCIPLINE RESPONSE

The following list is representative, not inclusive. Any behavior may be elevated to the next step based on severity/frequency/intent

Campers and staff have the right to be safe and secure in their persons. ~ California Constitution, Article 1 Section 28 (7)

STEP 1 BEHAVIORS

Clear verbal reminder of expectation by JC or Staff directly to the camper

- Being disrespectful or unkind to others
- Not listening to a JC or Staff
- Foul language
- Lying
- Disrespecting nature or facilities
- Throwing objects
- “Play” fighting, pushing (jostling)
- Disruptive in dormitories, including banging on walls, climbing from one top bunk to another, swinging on rafters, etc.
- Touching or disrupting camper while sleeping
- Disruptive or unruly during program activities or in Dining Hall
- Inappropriate clothing as described by the Dress Code –offensive clothing may be confiscated
- Intentionally excluding others

CAMPER RIGHTS:

CAMPERS HAVE THE RIGHT TO RELATE THEIR “SIDE OF THE STORY” BEFORE A DISCIPLINE CONSEQUENCE IS CARRIED OUT.

STEP 2 BEHAVIORS

Camper immediately sent to Summer Camp Director. Camper calls home. Parent and child are warned about imminent dismissal

- Repeat Step 1 offenses
- Spitting on another student
- Sexual or racial comments or references
- Hate language (e.g. gay, retarded, wetback, nigger)
- Flashing, mooning, “Pantsing”; exposing one’s genitalia, breasts, or buttocks
- Acts of physical force, pushing forcefully
- Any prank or joke that makes a camper upset or singles out a camper

STEP 3 BEHAVIORS

Camper immediately sent home.

- Repeat Step 1 or 2 offenses
- Violent behavior
- Theft, Vandalism, Dorm raiding
- Harassment
 - Opening stalls to toilet while occupied
 - Exposing or touching another person’s private area
- Bullying, Intimidation
- Purposely urinating or defecating elsewhere than in toilet

While Summer Camp is an extension of Stanislaus County Office of Education, it is not a school setting. Participants voluntarily register and participants not able to comply with behavior expectations will be sent home and may be excluded from future participation. Participants sent home early will not receive a refund.
